THE MAYO PEACE PARK, GARDEN OF REMEMRANCE, CASTLEBAR

The Mayo Peace Park in the centre of Castlebar was officially opened by the President of Ireland, Mary McAleese on the 7th October 2008.

It was developed to remember a The service and bravery of the forgotten generation of brave, heroic local people from every town and village in the county of Mayo whose service and sacrifice had been forgotten. They had served with the Allied Forces of the British, American, Canadian, Australian, New Zealand and South African Forces.

The park commemorates all those who served and died in world wars and conflicts of the past century. Many of the brave men and women whose names commemorated were immigrants living in these various countries when war broke out.

Many others were volunteers who joined the Allied Forces and had to leave their families and homes to serve, many never to return again.

soldiers who fought in wars in mainland Europe and other countries was only recognised for many years by the soldier's own family and friends. The park also honours the memory of all officers of An Gárda Síochána and soldiers of the Irish Defence Forces who gave their lives in the service of Ireland. The Mayo Peace Park offers a tranquil oasis of peace and respect where families of the fallen may reflect on the lives and sacrifice of their loved ones

The founder of the Mayo Peace Park, Michael Feeney, dedicated most of his life researching the names and details of all those who died. This task took him over thirty years to complete.

The names of the brave are inscribed on the black granite memorial stones, never to be forgotten.

Michael is also accredited with the historical books, Mayo Comrades of the Great War and Remembering Mayo's Fallen Heroes.
